

The Advent wreath

As we light the first candle in the Advent Wreath we remember Abraham and Sarah, our ancestors in faith. We give thanks for all those who in the centuries before the birth of Jesus, lived by trust and obedience to God

A candle is lit on the Advent wreath and this prayer is said:

All: Lord Jesus, light of the world, born in David's city of Bethlehem, born like him to be a king: be born in our hearts at Christmas, be King of our lives today.

Prayers of Penitence at the Advent Wreath

Let us bring into the Light of Christ the darkness of our world its pain and sadness, and our own mistakes and failings.



Heavenly Father, you have created a universe of light: forgive us when we return to darkness. Lord, have mercy.

All: Kyrie...

Lord Jesus, you are the light of the world: release us from life's shadows. Christ, have mercy.

All: Christe...

Holy Spirit, you give us light in our hearts: renew us in faith and love. Lord, have mercy.

All: Kyrie... x2

Absolution

Almighty God, who in Jesus Christ has given us a kingdom that cannot be destroyed, forgive you your sins, open your eyes to God's truth, strengthen you to do God's will and give you the joy of his kingdom, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The Collect

Almighty God, give us grace to cast away the works of darkness and to put on the armour of light, now in the time of this mortal life, in which your Son Jesus Christ came to us in great humility; that on the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge the living and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

™ The Liturgy of the Word ™

First reading: Isaiah 2: 1-5

A reading from the Book of the prophet Isaiah.

The word that Isaiah son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem.

In days to come the mountain of the Lord's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be raised above the hills; all the nations shall stream to it. Many peoples shall come and say, 'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob; that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths.' For out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations, and shall arbitrate for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning-hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more.

O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord!

Reader Hear the word of the Lord.

The Creed

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you

All: and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

All: we lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: it is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right and good to give you thanks and praise, almighty God and everlasting Father, through Jesus Christ your Son.

For when he humbled himself to come among us in human flesh, he fulfilled the plan you formed before the foundation of the world to open for us the way of salvation.

Confident that your promise will be fulfilled, we now watch for the day when Christ our Lord will come again in glory.

And so we join our voices with angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven to proclaim your glory,

for ever praising you and singing:



We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you.

The president breaks the consecrated bread. We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

All: Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.



Giving of Communion

God's holy gifts for God's holy people.

All: Jesus Christ is holy,
Jesus Christ is Lord,
to the glory of God the Father.
Amen.

All are welcome to gather around the altar, as directed, to receive Communion or a blessing. If you are a visitor and usually receive Communion in your home church you are welcome to receive here.

Holy Communion may be received in the bread alone, or in bread and wine as you prefer. Please indicate clearly what you wish to receive, and wait until those standing with you have received before returning to your place.

The practice of intinction (dipping) the host is not permitted.

During Communion James sings 'Creator of the Starry Height' And leads us in singing the Taizé Chant 'Wait for the Lord'



Prayer after Communion

All: O Lord our God, make us watchful and keep us faithful as we await the coming of your Son our Lord; that, when he shall appear, he may not find us sleeping in sin but active in his service and joyful in his praise; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.


All: Amen.
